

MARKING PERIODS AND SCHEDULE CHANGES

REQUEST FOR SCHEDULE CHANGES

Changes will be considered only for the following reasons:

1. Add courses required for graduation
2. Academic level change to accommodate student's ability
3. Failures (end of year or summer school)
4. Job - letters from parent and employer required (carefully screened)
5. Add a course during a free period after the two week schedule moratorium

- October 6, 2017 - 5 Week Portal Reports
- November 9, 2017 1st Marking Period Ends – Portal Report Cards
- December 15, 2017 - 5 Week Portal Reports
- January 26, 2018 2nd Marking Period Ends – Portal Report Cards (End of 1st Semester)
- March 2, 2018 - 5 Week Portal Reports
- March 29, 2018 3rd Marking Period Ends – Portal Report Cards
- May 11, 2017 - 5 Week Portal Reports
- June 21, 2018 4th Marking Period Ends – Portal Report Cards (End of 2nd Semester)

TIMELINE FOR SCHEDULE CHANGES

- Last day to **add** a semester 1 course: September 26, 2017
- Last day to **add** a full year or every other day course: September 29, 2017
- Last day to **drop** a semester 1 course without “WF” on transcript: October 13, 2017
- Last day to **drop** an every other day course without “WF” on transcript: October 20, 2017
- Last day to **drop an AP course** without “WF” on transcript: November 3, 2017
- Last day to **drop** a full year course (non-AP) without “WF” on transcript: November 9, 2017
- Last day to **add** a semester 2 course: February 2, 2018
- Last day to **drop** a semester 2 course without “WF” on transcript: February 9, 2018

In addition, no class will be dropped (including level changes) for any reason after the first full week of the second half of that class.

GUIDANCE AND COUSELING SERVICES

The East Islip High School Guidance Department provides students with not only personal and academic counseling but also a myriad of other services. A progressive and formalized career awareness and decision-making program is delivered each year beginning in grade seven. Computers are available in the guidance office to provide students with access to data on career information, college selection and financial aid information. A complete guidance media center is also available to students.

Many evening programs are presented in an attempt to keep parents informed and involved in their child's educational process. Subjects such as graduation requirements, college selection, college athletics, and financial aid are covered in these sessions. Students and parents are encouraged to use these services and facilities. Students may see their counselors during free periods or schedule an appointment by signing a request sheet, which is located in the guidance office.
