MTG. CALLED TO ORDER: I.) Meeting called to order by Mr. Reed at 6:00 p.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: II.) Motion by Mrs. Phillips to adjourn public session in order to convene to executive session; seconded by Mr. Sargent and unanimously approved.

PUBLIC SESSION: III.) Motion by Mr. Sargent to adjourn executive session in order to reconvene in open public session; seconded by Mrs. Phillips and unanimously approved.
Public session called to order at 8:10 p.m.

SALUTE TO THE FLAG IV): Mr. Reed led those in attendance to a salute to the flag.

PUBLIC ADVISED: V.) The Chairman advised the public that the Board would accept questions from the public and employees of the district, concerning agenda items, under New Business. Members of the audience wishing to avail themselves of the opportunity to ask a question are required to sign in at the door prior to the start of the meeting. The District Clerk will then call upon each member, allowing each three minutes, to address the Board. Questions by the public will be addressed immediately and addressed at the next regularly scheduled Board of Education Meeting. Members of the Board will also be available after the meeting to speak to anyone wishing to do so. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

a. Mr. Finello introduced Dr. Lisa Belz, Principal of Timber Point Elementary School, who presented fifth grade teacher Mrs. Giordano and her 5th grade class, also known as "The Recyclinators." Mrs. Giordano reported that the "recyclinators" were declared New York State Winner's in the 2012 Disney Planet Challenge. This is the first time, in the history of the competition, that a school has been awarded the title of State Champions more than once. The Challenge is a nationwide, project based learning adventure that empowers students to make a difference. Learning is hands-on and intertwined with existing curriculum. Special recognition was given to these 5th grade students by US Congressman Steve Israel who acknowledged them in the Congressional Record on May 30th. The children worked with the Congressman to co-author legislation requiring stores to recycle alkaline batteries. The bill is currently on the floor of the House of Representatives. While recycling was the focus of their project, other

achievements include initiating a "Don't Throw It in the Trash, Turn It into Cash" community recycling event, hosting a "Families Going Green" program for the public at the East Islip Library, creating a selling reusable grocery bags & eco-calendars, distributing water bottles to all students and staff at Timber Point, presenting a student run "America Recycles Day" slide show and creating a compost pile at their school.

b. Mr. Finello introduced Mr. Stephen Restivo, Health, Physical Education and Athletic Director, who presented the girls' varsity softball team, this season's Suffolk County Class AA Champions, as well as head coach, Jason McGowan and assistant coach Brittany DeVries.

c. Mr. Finello announced this year's high school graduation ceremony, which is taking place Friday evening June 22.

CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION - Mrs. Becker-Santa

Academic Intervention Services (AIS) Plan - Mrs. Becker-Santa presented East Islip's Academic Intervention Services Plan 2011-2013 to the Board for approval. The plan includes the district's menu of services, student eligibility by grade level and form notification letters, which are required to be sent home to parents when students are eligible for such services.

This contract is for health services provided to two of our students who attend Ivy League School located in the Hauppauge Public Schools. The cost is \$1,557.38; and, approve the Health Services Contract with Commack Union Free School District for the 2011-12 school year. This contract is for health services provided to two of our students who attend the Jewish Academy of Suffolk County located in the Commack School District. The cost is \$1,592.24; Seconded by Mr. Cronin and unanimously approved. Mr. Reed questioned whether the cost was for one student. Mr. Fraser responded that it was for two students.

CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES: e) Motion by Mr. Raffone to approve the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION of the East Islip School District approve the contract with the Great Neck Math Enrichment Center, Inc. for the purpose of providing administrative services in the math and science departments while the district's director is out on family leave. These services are for six months and will cost \$69,300; Seconded by Mr. Cronin and unanimously approved. Mrs. Phillips requested that Mrs. Becker-Santa explain the importance of this position. Mrs. Becker-Santa explained that this position will not only provide science and math director duties during the current director's medical leave, but will also help by providing assistance with the Student Learning Objectives as required by the new State APPR requirements. She stated that Mariana Ristea from the enrichment center is extremely strong in this area.

EAST ISLIP BIDS: f) BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION of the East Islip School District approve the following bids:

Air Conditioning & Refrigeration Repairs & Service - Bid #050912-1 to Best Climate Control Corporation for the 2012-13 school year: Motion by Mr. Cronin; Seconded by Mr. Raffone and unanimously approved. Mrs. Phillips questioned the higher hourly cost of this bidder and whether they were in fact the lowest bidder. Mr. Fraser confirmed that based on additional calculations, this company's cost is the lowest.

Elevator Repair and Service - Bid #052312-2 - to Island Elevator for the 2012-13 school: Motion by Mr. Raffone; Seconded by Mr. Cronin and unanimously approved.

Plumbing Repair and Service - Bid #050912-2 - to Seaford Avenue Corporation for the 2012-13 school year: Motion by Mr. Cronin; Seconded by Mr. Raffone and unanimously approved.

Printing Services - Bid #053112-1 - to A to Z Printing, Ltd., All Color Business, American Business, C & C Printing, Gallery Printing, Good Mojo, Lotus Printing, Image, North Shore Printing, Paper Mart, Precision Envelope, and WB Mason for items in which they were the lowest responsible bidder for the 2012-13 school year: Motion by Mr. Raffone; Seconded by Mr. Cronin and unanimously approved.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE: g) Motion by Mr. Cronin to approve the following resolution: BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION of the East Islip School District approve the student accident insurance coverage offered through Pupil Benefits at a

premium of \$47,902, and catastrophic coverage through National Union Fire Insurance Company of Pittsburgh, Pa. at a premium of \$2,179 effective July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. The total premium of \$50,081 is \$15,279 higher than the current year through Commercial Travelers Insurance. Commercial Travelers is no longer writing business in Suffolk County due to very negative claims experience; Seconded by Mr. Raffone and unanimously approved. Mr. Reed asked if the company offers a clause, if there are no claims, to reduce the premiums and questioned the number of claims we had last year. Mr. Fraser stated that the premiums are based on student enrollment and participation in sports. He also said that our claims are higher because the district is becoming the primary insurance carrier for many claims due to the state of the economy (people out of work, etc.).

SCHOOL LUNCH PRICES: h) Motion by Mr. Sargent to approve the following resolution: BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION of the East Islip School District approve an increase of ten (10) cents to the lunch prices for our elementary and secondary schools. The new lunch price for the elementary schools will therefore be \$1.60, and for the middle and high schools the new price will be \$1.70; Seconded by Mr. Cronin and unanimously approved. Mrs. Phillips read a sentence from a letter sent by the coordinator of the State Nutrition Program. East Islip is below the price level of the State requirements and even though we may be running in the black, we must raise prices to be more aligned with the State's costs.

DONATIONS: k) Motion by Mrs. Phillips to accept the donation of \$2,045.46 from the Middle School General Organization (G.O.) Student Activity Account to purchase and install one complete ceiling mounted multimedia projector and screen for the music suite. This projector will enhance the learning experience of all students; Seconded by Mr. Raffone and unanimously approved.
